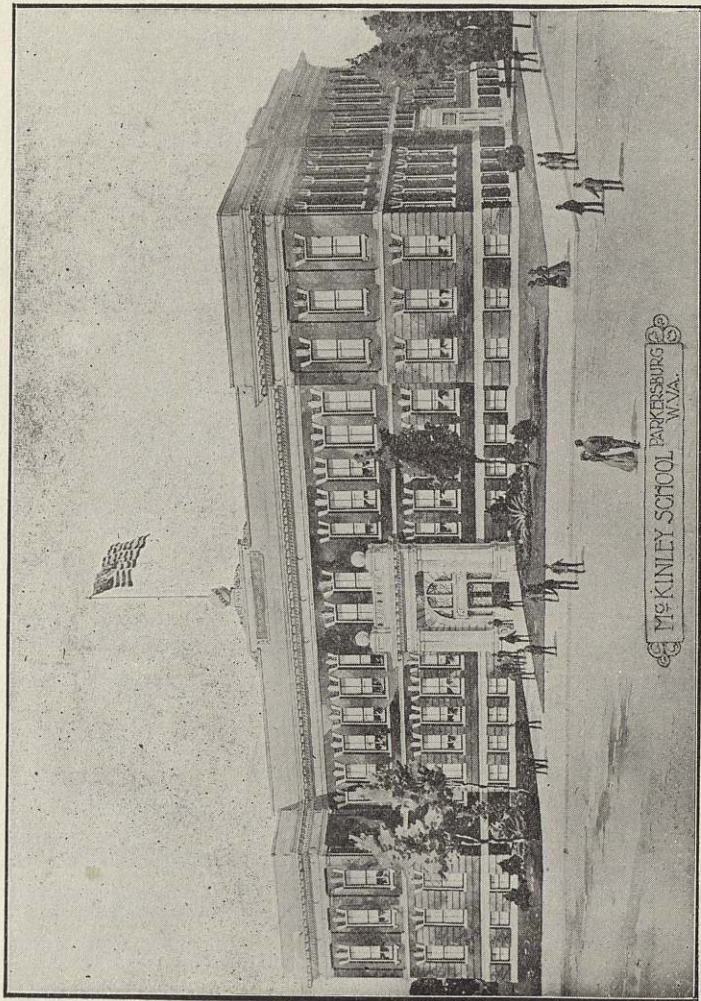

INFORMATION AND RULES RELATING TO THE HIGH SCHOOL

SESSIONS.

1. The daily sessions will open at 9 a. m. and close at 4 p. m. with an intermission from 12 m. to 1:30 p. m., except during one session period when school will begin at 8 a. m. and close at 12:30 p. m.

2. Teachers must be in their respective rooms by 8:30 a. m. and 1:10 p. m.

3. Except by special arrangement with the teacher of the room concerned or during inclement weather students must not enter the corridors before 8:30 a. m. and 1:10 p. m. When for proper reasons, as above, students do enter the corridors before time they are to go to and remain in the High School rooms.

CONDUCT.

1. One great object of the existence of the Parkersburg High School is to instill the habit of self-restraint and self-direction. To secure this vital preparation for good citizenship, parents and citizens are urged to co-operate with teachers and school officers in every way possible.

APPLICATION AND GRADES.

1. The monthly grades in conduct, application and studies will this year be marked on the scale of 10, using all numbers, if necessary, between 1 and 10. 10 shall stand for a higher grade of excellence than that represented by 9 under the old system; and where ever per cents are reckoned, it shall represent a standing of 95% or above. The lower numbers shall represent standings in a similar way as follows:

10 means a standing of 95% or above.

9 means a standing of 85% to 95%.

8 means a standing of 75% to 85%.

7 means a standing of 65% to 75%.

6, 5, 4, etc., in like manner.

2. For the purpose of marking grades on report cards the ninth month shall be considered as closing on the day before final examinations begin.

3. Pupils who wish to be promoted at the close of the ninth month without examinations in all branches, must NOT BE ABSENT 35 DAYS, and must have at least 75 at the foot of each of the columns in conduct, application and the four studies of the required course.

Pupils whose report cards show an absence of less than 35 days and 75 in the conduct and application columns, but not 75

in all the study columns, must be examined in those branches in which the report card does not show 75.

4. The passing grade for final examinations shall be 75 per cent.

5. Any student who, through poor preparation, irregular attendance or lack of industry fails to do passing work in any subject may be assigned to a lower class or grade or to less work in the same grade, by the Principal with the concurrence of the Superintendent. This shall not be done however, until the parent or guardian has been duly consulted.

STUDIES.

1. All students must take four studies in some one of the High School courses unless excused by the Principal for good and sufficient reasons.

2. All are urged, after choosing a course, to pursue that course to graduation. But at the discretion of the Superintendent and Principal, equivalent subjects in other courses may be accepted.

ABSENCE AND TARDINESS.

1. The importance of REGULAR ATTENDANCE is urged upon students and parents. When illness or other sufficient reason necessitates absence a satisfactory excuse should be brought from parent or guardian upon the student's return to school. This excuse should state the fact of illness or other general facts which caused the absence.

2. Unnecessary absence shall count against the grade in application

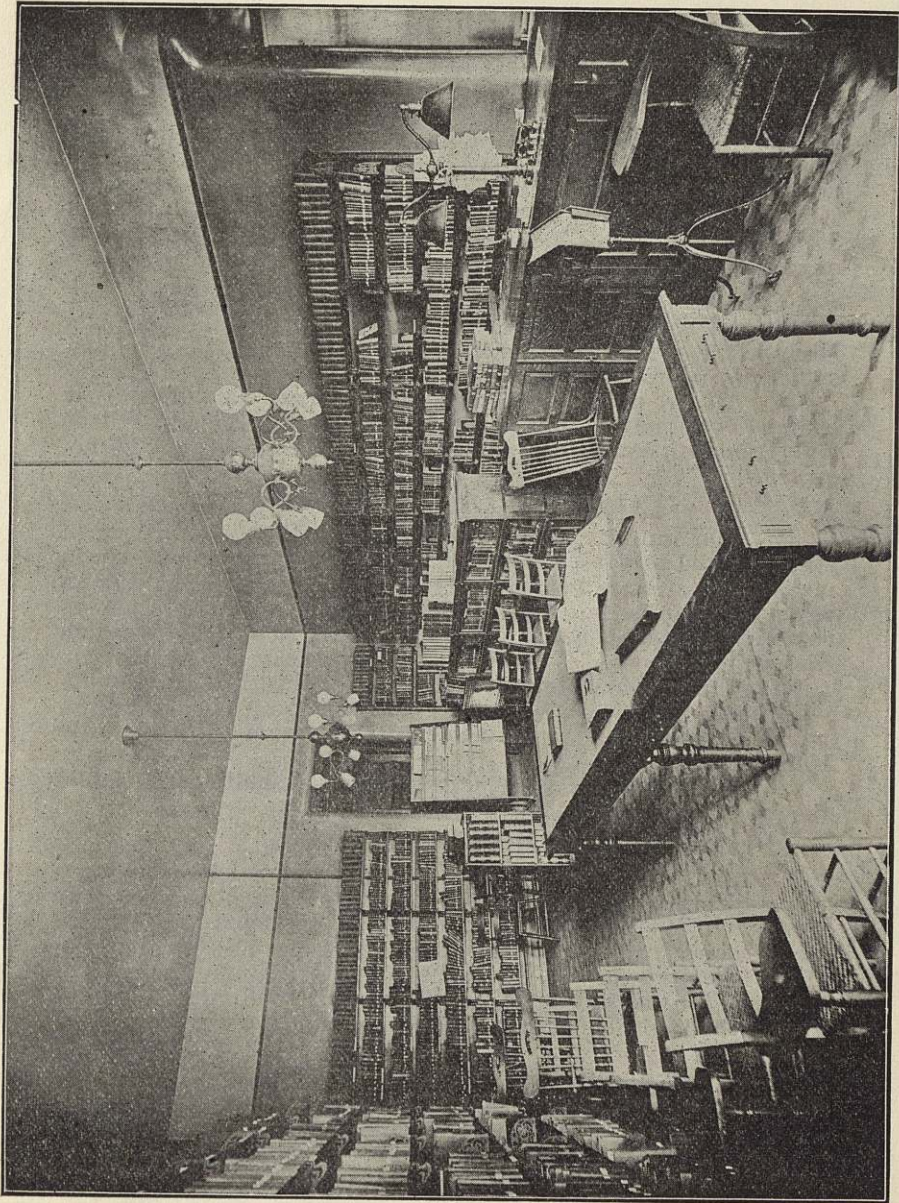
3. A student is tardy who enters his room after the tardy bell.

4. Tardiness not satisfactorily excused shall count against the grade in conduct.

GRADUATION HONORS.

1. All Seniors in the Parkersburg High School who attain the required standing shall be ranked as high honor or honor students. To attain the "high honor" distinction a student must make 95 per cent of the maximum grades for the full course of High School work. An "honor" shall mean a grade of at least 90 per cent. for the full course. Foreign pupils who enter the second year of the High School may compete for honors upon three years' work.

2. From these two groupes of "high honor" and "honor" students the High School faculty shall select or approve not less



than six nor more than fourteen to represent the class in any graduating or class-day exercises which may be held. These shall be selected, as far as may be, with reference to their ability to write and to speak.

3. The student having the highest grades for the full course shall be the class valedictorian. The next highest shall be salutatorian.

TUITION IN HIGH SCHOOL.

1. The tuition for students from outside Parkersburg District is \$2.00 a month, payable monthly in advance to the Superintendent.

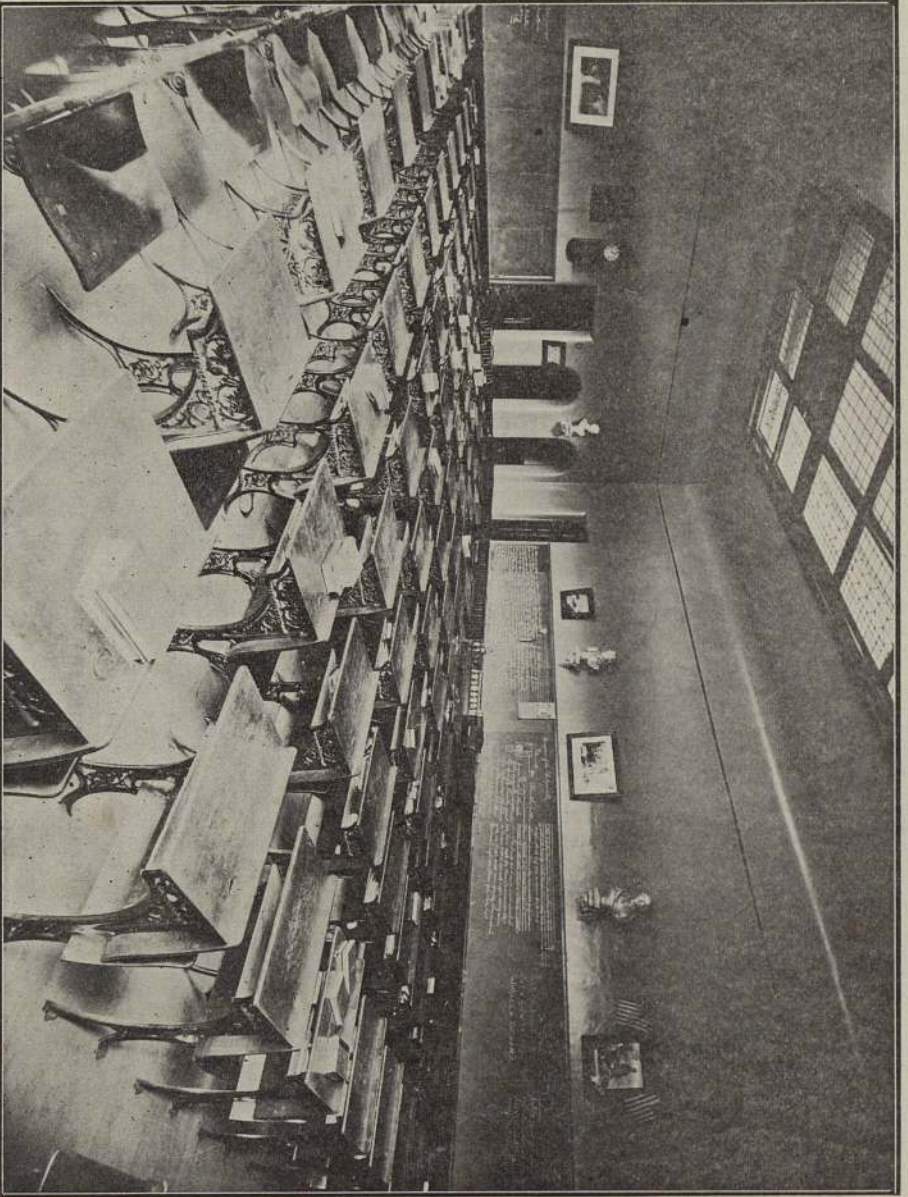

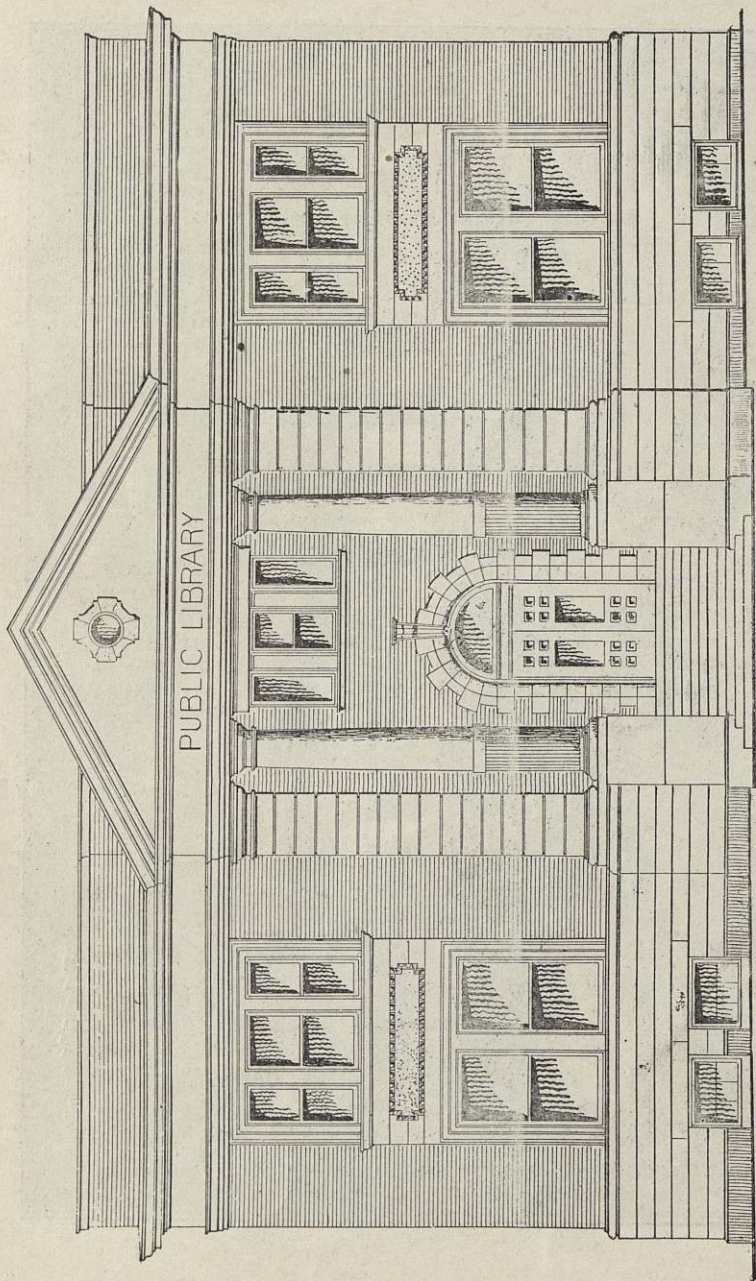
