SITUATION

Moundsville is on the right bank of the Ohio river, ten miles below Wheeling, and gets its name from the famous mound situated in the heart of the city. This mound dating back to prehistoric times, is the largest of its kind in the world.

But in the last few years the over-crowding of Wheeling and Bellaire, made it necessary to seek new locations for many of the manufacturing plants which have made these cities so famous in the industrial world.




