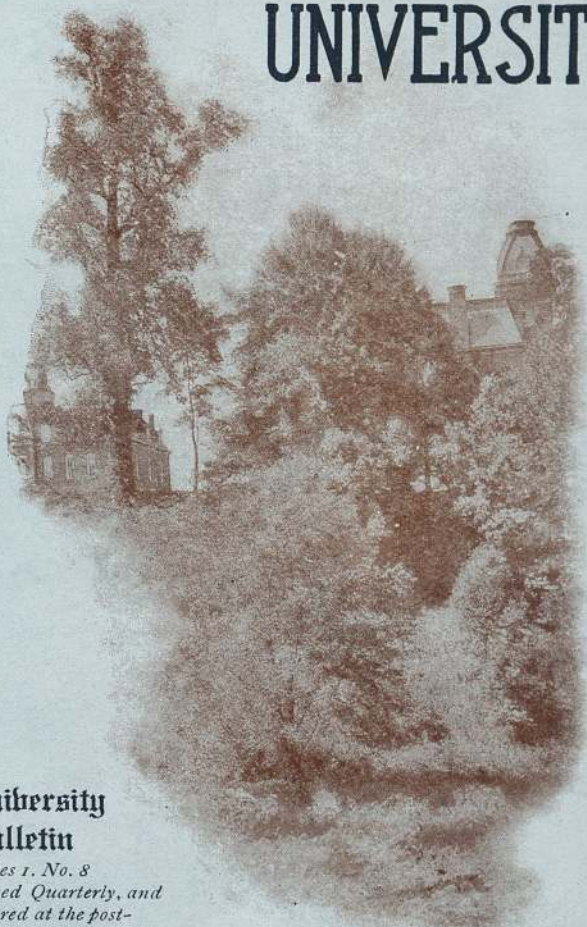

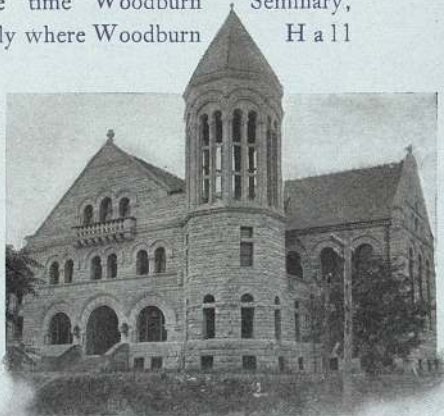
## BACK TO 1814

**T**HROUGH its direct predecessors the institution now known everywhere as West

Virginia University reaches back over a period of nearly one hundred years. Monongalia Academy was established in 1814 and existed as a prosperous school of high grade until it became a part of the new university in 1867. At the same time Woodburn Seminary, standing exactly where Woodburn

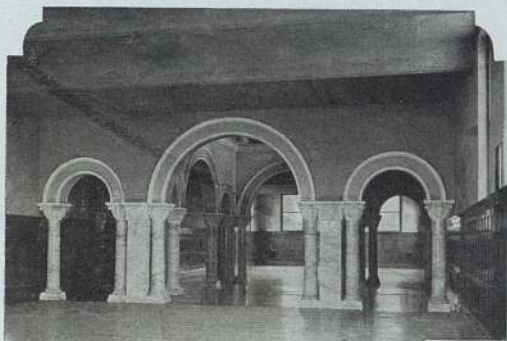

now stands, was merged into the new and larger institution. Since the year 1867 the words college and university have taken the place of academy

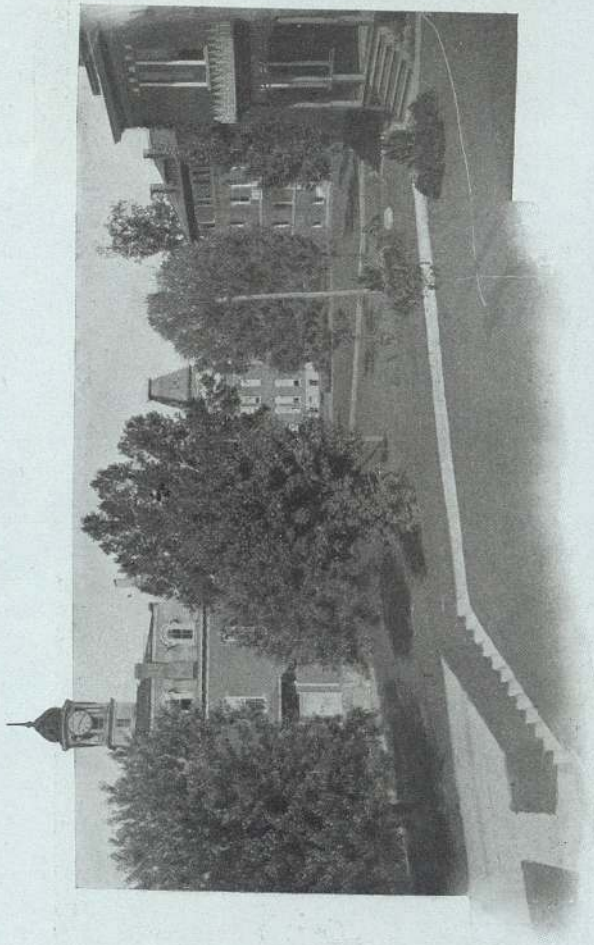

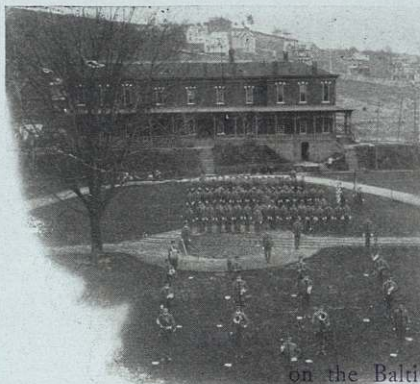

and universities of the world.

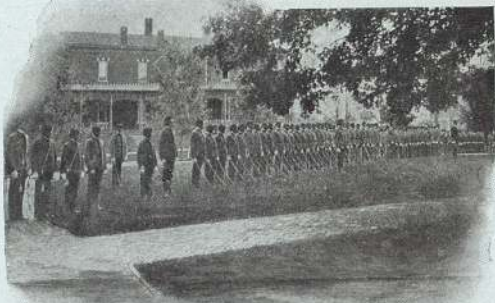
**ITS FIELD.** That West Virginia University

elective, leading to the degrees of A.B., and B.S., and the graduate degrees of A.M., M.S., and Ph.D. The libraries and laboratories enable the instructors to insist upon modern college work of the highest order.

**THE COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING** has its own spacious and handsome new building, thoroughly equipped with the latest engineering apparatus and machinery. The various engineering degrees are given.

**THE COLLEGE OF LAW.** There are comparatively few lawyers of middle life or younger now practicing in West Virginia who did not receive their legal education at West Virginia University. Still others are practicing in all parts of the world—Japan, Bulgaria, Turkey, South Africa.

**THE COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE** is contributing largely to the improvement of farming conditions. In addition to Agriculture, there are taught Stock Raising, Horticulture, Veterinary Science, etc.

## THE SOLDIERS.


The new Armory, the headquarters of the Military department, is one of the handsomest buildings on the campus. An

The state maintains three preparatory schools as special fitting schools for the University. They

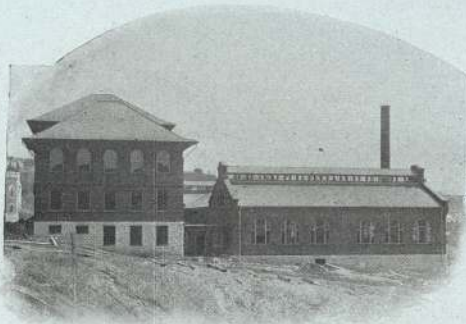

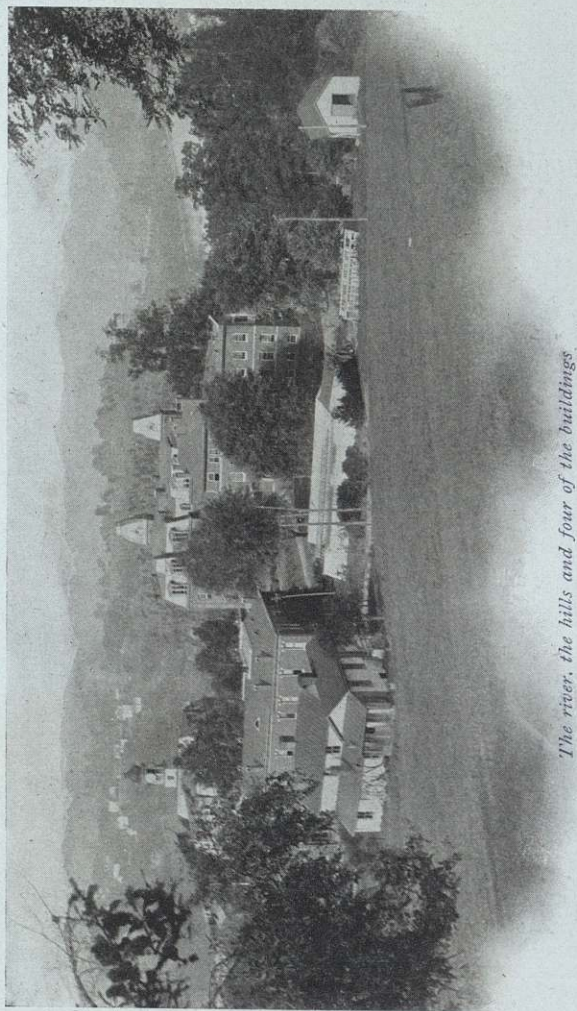

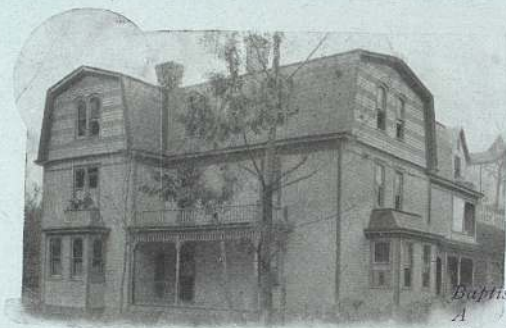

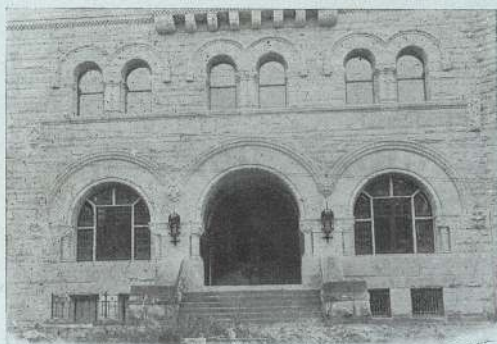
