When to Open.—Powhatan College will open its first session in September, 1900. All necessary arrangements have been made and the work so pushed that this opening shall be second to that of no other college in the Virginias.

LOCATION.-No town can be found anywhere more suitable for the seat of an institution of learning than Charles Town. It being located at the mouth of the "far famed" Shenandoah Valley, on high rolling table land, is by nature noted for its healthful climate, its mild and even temberature, its fertile soil and beautiful scenery. Charles Town is a city of schools and churches, christian homes and hospitable people. Its location at the Junction of the Valley Division of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad with the Norfolk and Western Railroad places it in direct touch with all the large cities of the East, especially Washington, D. C,

BUILDINGS, EQUIPMENTS AND SUR-ROUNDINGS.—The main college building is, perhaps, the most modern, commodious and beautiful one in the state. It is new, and was erected and furnished at a cost of about \$60,000.00. Every nook and corner is modern and up to date, all appointments are arranged with the view to comfort and safety. Every room is large, airy and comfortable, and is furnished with solid oak chamber suites of artistic designs. The entire building is heated throughout with steam heat, lighted with both gas and electricity. Bath rooms and hot and cold water are on each floor. On the whole Powhatan College building, for beauty, safety, elegance and comfort is unexcelled. It stands on a gently elevated knoll overlooking the city and surrounding country.-From the college porches the eye of the observer can look out upon some of nature's most beautiful scenes. The noted Shenandoah valley stretches away to the Southland, the historic Shenandoah river is seen in outline, to wind on its northeast course to meet the Potomac at Harper's Ferry, while the encircling mountains lift their rugged and often snow-capped peaks heavenward.

The Aim.—It is the aim of Powhatan college to offer young women that broad and liberal education about which we hear so much, and of which we have so little. It is the purpose of this institution

to develope equally and harmoniously the physical, mental and spiritual being. Ten separate and distinct courses of study shall be sustained—Classical, Scientific, Literary, Normal, Music, Art, Elocution, Stenography, Typewriting and Business courses.

THE FACULTY.—To sustain these cources or departments of study the best and most efficient teachers to be found havebeen secured, so that each department will be headed by a master and teacher of experience, reputation and ability. As the teacher is so is and must be the school, hence the great importance of securing, as we have, the best.

PLEASANT HOME LIFE.—To the school girl away from home and home friends no question is of more importance than that of the college home and its surroundings. It is here that the college days are to be made pleasant or unpleasant. At Powhatan College no false dignity or pretentious formality shall separate student and teachers, but all, teacher and student, shall join heart and hand to make the college-home a home, a home indeed, and a christian home.
