Preface.

Believing that a complete brigade roster would be appreciated by the officers and Sir Knights and of great benefit to our department, I undertook the work of publishing this volume, hoping that my successors and other brigade commanders might see the benefits derived therefrom and do likewise.

In order that it might be as near complete as possible I have inserted a brief history of the brigade. In collecting the data for this history I had to work under serious difficulties in not having complete records at hand and had to gather the information from many different sources. There are very likely some errors in this edition, which will be corrected by the committee appointed to compile the history of the brigade, in the next edition.

You will note that the date of muster is given with each company and regiment and also a complete roster of those companies which complied with my request. So if the roster of any company is not in this book it is the fault of their officers and not of the author. Furthermore, the appearance of a company roster in this book does not signify that the company is in good standing, but all were during 1908, except those that have been mustered in since then. This book will be in the hands of the printer before all the reports for 1909 are in.

This little volume is the result of many hours of labor and we sincerely hope it will be preserved by the members as a record and souvenir, and that it may prove of great benefit to the order we all love.

Brief History of West Virginia Brigade, U. R. K. P.

The committee appointed at Huntington to compile the history of this brigade not having met, I have collected the following data in order that it might appear in this book. This is not intended to take the work from the committee, but will possibly aid them.

The first company or division to be organized within this domain was Couer-de-Leon, No. 1, of Wheeling, and was mustered in May 7th, 1881, and is still active.

After a period of six years Kanawha Division, No. 2, was mustered in at Charleston on July 2, 1887. This company was active for several years, but finally dropped out and several other companies have been organized in Charleston since then, and the only one active at the present time is Glendale Co., No. 18. The third company or division to be organized was Parkersburg, No. 3, which is still active. This company was mustered in December 14, 1888, and along with No. 1 has played an important part in the history of the brigade. They have attended most of the encampments and have taken several prizes. Each company has furnished a brigade commander and No. 3 gained quite a name for its members through their famous "Imp" drill.

Within the two years following the organi-

zation of No. 3 six divisions were mustered in at the following places: Martinsburg, No. 4; Clarksburg, No. 5; Huntington, No. 6; Sewell, No. 7; Weston, No. 8, and Davis, No. 9. None of these companies are active at present, although we have good companies at Huntington and Clarksburg.

Sufficient companies or divisions having been mustered in to form a regiment, the First was organized October 14, 1890, during a Grand Lodge meeting, and J. W. Mathers was elected to command. During the following year fine progress was made and eight new divisions were mustered in, and on October 13, 1891, the Second regiment was organized and C. C. Rand was elected to command.

At the same assembly and immediately following the organization of the Second regiment, the West Virginia brigade was formed. The assembly was held at Parkersburg and Major General Carnahan presided and Colonel J. W. Mathers was elected the first Brigade Commander. A. Howard Fleming was elected to succeed Colonel Mathers as colonel of the First regiment.

It appears that the brigade came almost to a standstill for the next five years, or during General Mathers' term, which expired October 14, 1896. Only nine companies were mustered in and five old ones were lost, leaving twenty-one active companies.

Colonel C. C. Rand was elected to succeed General Mather, but owing to business matters requiring all his attention he resigned on October 11, 1899, and James H. Lancaster was elected to succeed him.

During General Rand's term five companies were organized and five were lost.

General Lancaster served a full term and was succeeded by J. Alex. Ewing on October 14, 1903. General Lancaster organized several

companies and the first artillery company in the U. R. K. P. The Third regiment was organized October 13, 1902, which was during General Lancaster's term.

While General Ewing was in command more companies were organized than under any previous commander, which was due to the fact that the whole muster fee was paid to the organizer. General Ewing also organized the Fourth regiment in March, 1905.

General Ewing's commission expired on October 14, 1907, and Charles A. Barlow was elected to succeed him. Up to the time this history was written General Barlow had organized five new companies and had three old ones reinstated and lost no companies that were in good standing February 19, 1908. Five of the companies organized in 1907 never made a report after that of the mustering officer.

All of the brigade commanders started to keep a record of their commands, but none of them kept it for more than two years, and therefore our records are far from being complete. At present the brigade headquarters have a regular printed book for keeping records and future commanders can keep the records with little trouble, and for the benefit of future generations it is to be hoped that they will never be neglected again.

Among the many interesting things found in looking up this history we wish to mention one or two. The difference in initiation fees ranged from one to fifteen dollars and the dues from one to five dollars. It appears that Parkersburg and Clarksburg divisions charged fifteen dollars initiation and four and five dollars respectively for dues. So you can consider yourself fortunate to be able to get into such a grand order for the small sum of five dollars now and your dues will hardly exceed three dollars in any company.

The first funds for a regiment were collected by assessing each company three dollars and we find that ten divisions paid and seven did not, yet Colonel Mather had fifty-six cents in his hands when he was elected Brigadier General.

There is no record of any company or division having been mustered out, yet there are more than thirty that are delinquent.

This brigade has the distinction of having the first company of Artillery and Signal Corps ever organized in the U. R. K. P., and it was through the efforts of this brigade that such were authorized by the Supreme bodies.

We now have forty-two active companies with a bright future for the brigade, and hope to increase our number to fifty before the first encampment, which is to be held at Parkersburg, September, 1909.



Circular Letter No. 1.

Wishing to extend to you my heartfelt thanks for the confidence shown in electing me to the highest office within your gift, I take this method of doing so and at the same time outline the work expected.

In assuming command of West Virginia Brigade, I faithfully promise to do everything in my power to make it second to none in our great order, and I sincerely hope I shall have the hearty co-operation and loyal support of every officer and Sir Knight in the work. It will be my endeavor to make the U. R. K. P. a Military Department in reality and to do so we must have military training and discipline.

We will not tolerate officers who seek the position simply to wear the straps and "look pretty on parade." They must be competent to handle their commands when the occasion arises and perform their duties promptly and enforce the "Rules and Regulations."

Nor do we want companies who only wear the uniform at funerals and parades. We want live and energetic members, who join our de-

partment for the social and military benefits. We want companies that can hold up the name and dignity of the order and not ones that will be the laughing stock of the spectators.

The dead timber must fall, so if the ax strikes your company, don't blame your superiors until you have examined your own vitality.

The U. R. can be made one of the best drilled and most efficient semi-military organizations in existence, provided the officers and Sir Knights take the proper interest and are loyal to their charge.

We have the material, so let us resolve to put forth our best effort in bringing the West Virginia Brigade to the front. Numbers do not count with efficiency, so cut out the dead and replace with new and vigorous material.

Stir up interest in your company. Have fairs, festivals, balls, entertainments, and by all means regular drills and assemblies. We are going to Boston next August and you can use this great trip to improve and create better interest in the work.

In ordering your drill regulations and supplies please bear in mind the fact that this office is without funds and that all profits received therefrom go to the brigade.

Again pledging my loyalty and very best efforts, and hoping you will not fail to ask me for any information or assistance I can give, for it is yours for the asking.

Brigadier General's Report.

I have the honor of submitting to you my first annual report of the transactions of this brigade, with a financial statement of the receipts and expenditures.

It requires considerable tact and energy to keep any kind of a secret organization up to its standard in panic times, such as we have experienced ever since my election, and I am glad that I can report to you that we have been gaining ground, not only in numbers, but in efficiency.

When I assumed command, October 14, 1907, we had only a few incomplete records with no funds or supplies, and things were not flattering for an active campaign, yet I had sufficient confidence in my command to know that it could be placed upon a sound footing with proper effort. At times the work has been very trying and we have encountered many obstacles, but we are glad to state that we now have one of the best equipped offices, we believe, in the Supreme domain, with a neat balance in our treasury, and our brigade in better shape than ever before.

NEW COMPANIES.

We have mustered in companies at Charleston, Charles Town, McDowell, Milton and Logan, and have reinstated companies at Smithfield, Elkins and Point Pleasant, with a total membership of two hundred and thirteen.

We are organizing companies at Bridgeport, Terra Alta, Morgantown, Kingwood and New Martinsville, and hope to have them mustered in soon.

DELINQUENT COMPANIES.

Upon investigation we found twenty-seven companies that had not reported for two years or more and had not been mustered out, and we issued an order mustering out the following companies:

It appears that these companies were allowed to drop out without the supplies having been collected, and we had no record of the last Captain, nor could we obtain such from

the Adjutant General, so we have had great difficulty in finding them and we think the officers and Sir Knights should aid us in collecting the rituals, etc. Future commanders will not have that trouble in finding the last Captain or the seniority of any commissioned officer, owing to the complete record we have inaugurated, and we hope all future brigade commanders will keep it as started.

FIFTH REGIMENT.

Believing it to be to the best interest of the brigade that a regiment should be formed in the southern end of the state, we rearranged the four existing regiments and called for an assembly of the line officers of the companies composing the new regiment at Charleston on February 25, 1908, and only two companies being represented, we could not hold the assembly, and same was postponed until we can get sufficient companies to form a quorum. We were greatly surprised at not having a quorum, knowing that most of the companies had just been organized and should be very active, but we have since learned that they were failures and a mistake was made by mustering some of them into the service. However, we have since mustered in some good companies in that district and we will have an assembly in the near future to complete the work. It is to be regretted that brothers should pay out their money for equipment, only to be thrown away, and we hope in the future that companies will only be organized in localities that can support them and that good, active men be placed at the head.

ELECTIONS.

Colonel W. H. Dunbar was re-elected colonel of the Second regiment at a most enjoyable assembly held at Parkersburg on March 20, 1908.

Colonel Charles F. Randall was elected colonel of the Third regiment to succeed Colonel J. B. Hess, at a very interesting assembly held at Fairmont on March 27, 1908. Every line officer in the regiment was present at this assembly.

The General attended the assemblies at Charleston, Parkersburg and Fairmont.

SUPREME ASSEMBLY.

There were about one hundred and twenty-five officers and Sir Knights at the Supreme Encampment, held in Boston, and all present report a very pleasant time and claim it was one of the most interesting trips they ever had.

The Supreme Assembly held a very profitable meeting and enacted some important laws. Among the more important changes in the Rules and Regulations we wish to mention the following: The short form ritual, permission for companies to use the rifle, service uniform, change of year to January 1st, regulating retired officers, etc. Companies are permitted to use the rifle in the armory, but must not use same while on parade or outside of the armory. The use of the khaki uniform is optional with the companies and is to be worn at drill, while traveling or in camp, and must not be worn on parade or during ceremonies. However, we would advise companies to procure these uniforms on account of their small cost and the wonderful saving to their regular uniforms. They are cool, serviceable and natty and your dress uniform can be kept in nice shape for parade and other ceremonies. A copy of the proceedings of the Supreme Assembly should be in the hands of all field and line officers, and those not having the same can procure a copy by making requisition to these headquarters.

By inquiries sent to all companies we

found that only a small number of Sir Knights could attend the Grand Lodge meeting, held at Hinton, and we did not deem it advisable to call a brigade assembly at that point.

BRIGADE ENCAMPMENT.

Believing that state encampments would aid us greatly and in order that we might hold them during the Grand Lodge meetings, we started a movement to have the time of the Grand Lodge meetings changed to earlier in the year, and we wish to thank the delegates to the Grand Lodge and the officers of same for granting our request, and our first encampment will be held at Parkersburg next September. From present indications this is going to be the greatest event in the history of our brigade and will be the means of increasing the membership in our department and the subordinate lodges. Those companies that have not already begun preparations to attend this encampment should do so at once and prepare to spend a week filled with pleasure of all kinds. The Parkersburg boys are preparing a feast of good things and are going to make it the banner event of West Virginia Pythianism. The brigade will have six hundred dollars which will be spent in helping make it a real encampment and outing. Companies desiring to enter the prize drills should begin work in earnest and drill as often as possible, using the United States Army Drill Regulations, with amendments adopted by the U. R. There will be just sufficient military discipline to make the encampment of benefit to the command and not enough to be a burden to any one.

We notice that there are a few very small companies which should be enlarged, and we consider the encampment idea a good one to use in adding members. We do not advocate begging Knights to become members of our department unless we know they will be active

ones, but the members should make known to the many young and active Knights the good qualities of the U. R., and if presented in the proper light we could add greatly to our number.

BRIGADE BAND.

Sergeant Frank W. Parker, of Randall, W. Va., has been appointed Chief Musician for the brigade and is at work organizing a brigade band. The prospects are very bright for a large and excellent organization. Music will be distributed from time to time and they will meet at Parkersburg to complete their organization and elect their leader. Each regiment should have a musician or trumpeter and the Colonels should correspond with Sergeant Parker and have him aid them in their selection. This band will make a great hit at Parkersburg and Milwaukee, for it will be composed of the best musicians of our little mountain state.

FIELD AND STAFF OFFICERS.

Judging from the inactivity of several field and staff officers, they must have considered that their appointment or election meant their retirement and that their labors in the U. R. were at an end. This is a grave error and the sooner these officers come to know that this inactivity may mean not only injury to their commands, but the annulment of their commissions, the better. This brigade is too large for just a few to keep it in shape and it needs the support and help of all the officers elected and appointed, as well as the Sir Knights. Field and staff officers should be among the most active in their respective companies and should use every effort in helping the line officers keep life in their companies.

The Colonels and Majors should visit all the companies within their commands as often as possible and when that is not possible, they should use some other method of keeping in close contact with them. They should attend

to all correspondence promptly and give the office the attention it requires or resign. No officer should be elected or appointed unless he is qualified for the position, an active worker, and agrees to continue so during the life of his commission. When we get such officers we will have a first-class organization.

The headsman's ax is going to be used in the near future and officers should examine their record and see if it will bear inspection. To bring this brigade up to the proper standard I need more support in the work and I feel confident that we have enough Sir Knights who will give it, if commissioned.

The dues and per capita taxes, paid to a brigade or regimental commander, belong to that brigade or regiment and the members thereof are entitled to know how it is spent and it should not be considered as a personal contribution. Therefore I shall require each regimental commander to live up to the Rules and Regulations and render a financial statement to his command yearly.

In conclusion, I wish to call your attention to the financial statement accompanying this report, which represents more business transacted during the fourteen months for which it calls than any similar period in the history of this brigade. We issued ten general and forty-two special orders and wrote hundreds of letters, bought a complete equipment of hand stamps, stationery and office supplies, and still have a nice balance in our treasury.

With the encampments at Parkersburg and Milwaukee and the bright future of our order, new life and vigor should be instilled into our membership, and I believe the year 1909 will show the greatest improvement of any within the history of this brigade.
