We congratulate the Stockholders upon the outlook for the future development of Belington, which is exceedingly flattering.

The Company has undertaken to have erected a large and commodious hotel, which will be completed and in running order in the early summer. A large number of the Stockholders who were allotted residence lots in the recent drawing, have arranged for the erection of handsome cottages in west Belington immediately. The Company has arranged for the grading of the principal streets, and the laying down of sidewalks.

A good planing mill is now in operation. The lumber for a roller mill is now on the ground, and the contract let for the building. The J. C. Willoughby Co., foundry will be moved to Belington at an early date, this will give employment to a number of men. The Belington Lumber and Manufacturing Company will at once erect a large box factory and general lumber and manufacturing, which will employ from twenty to thirty men.

The Belington Coal and Coke Company have purchased 3,000 acres of coal lands on the W. Va. Central R. R. just south of Belington, which they will commence operating within 60 days. They intend building a number of coke ovens immediately and will locate their works within three miles of Belington. This Coal and Coke Company will have their offices and stores at Belington. The Randolph Coal and Coke Company have already opened their mines four miles south of Belington on the said railroad, and are now shipping coal and preparing to erect a number of coke ovens for operation in a short time. Stock to the amount of \$25,000 has already been subscribed to the Belington Saving and Deposit Bank, and a handsome brick building will be built and the Bank in operation during the year.

These are enterprises that are assured beyond all doubt, while a number of others are contemplated and will doubtless be in operation in the very near future. The outlook for Belington is indeed encouraging. Its healthy location is unsurpassed. Its agricultural surroundings are splendid. It can be recommended with confidence to those seeking a home where health, prosperity and comfort will be assured with reasonable care and diligence. Every lot drawn of the 167 is a good lot.
