

MONONGALIA COUNTY.

These statistics are based mainly upon the United States census report for 1910 and the report of the West Virginia Geological survey for Marion, Monongalia and Taylor counties, and are for the year 1910 unless otherwise indicated.

HISTORICAL.

Monongalia County began its existance in Oct. 1776, by an act of the General Assembly of Va. Thus Monongalia enjoys the distinction of being one among the first counties created under a Republican form of Government in America. It was intended to be named for the Monongahela River, but through a clercial error received the former appellation. Tradition names Captain John Dent as the first sheriff and Joseph Coombs the first county clerk. The growth of population in the past ten years has mostly taken

place in the city of Morgantown, located in Morgan District and in Westover on the opposite of the river in Grant District. The five other Magisterial Districts have lost in population during the last decade. This marked decrease in rural population illustrates the country wide tendency of the younger generation to leave the farms for the city. During the last two or three years however, the high cost of living in cities and towns has awakened a new interest in agriculture, and started a back to the farm movement here as well as elsewhere. Morgantown the county seat of Monongalia is the largest and most important town in the county, it was settled by Thomas Decker in 1758.




