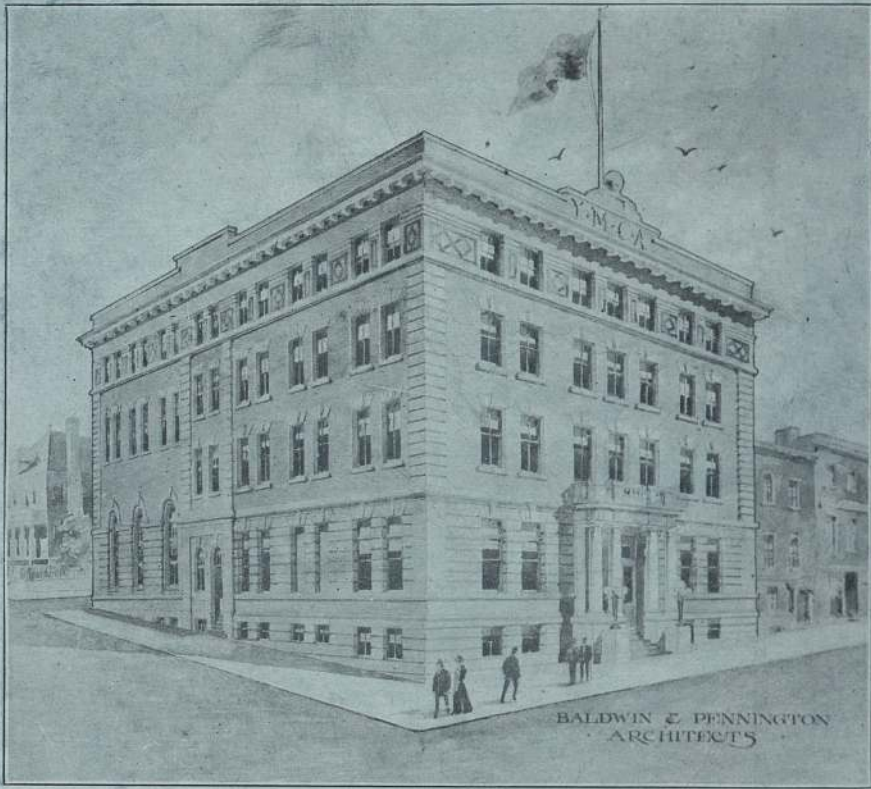

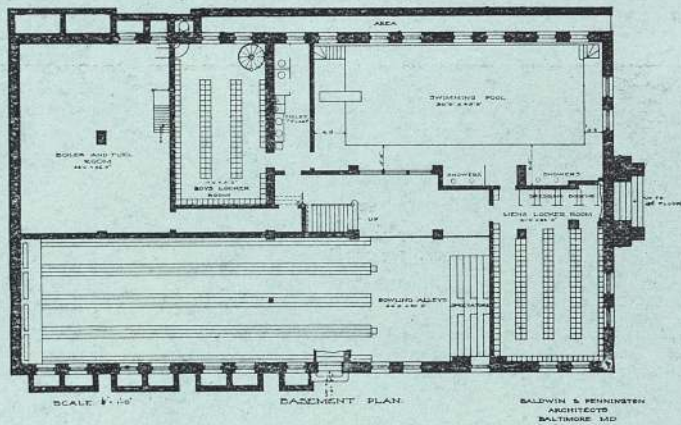

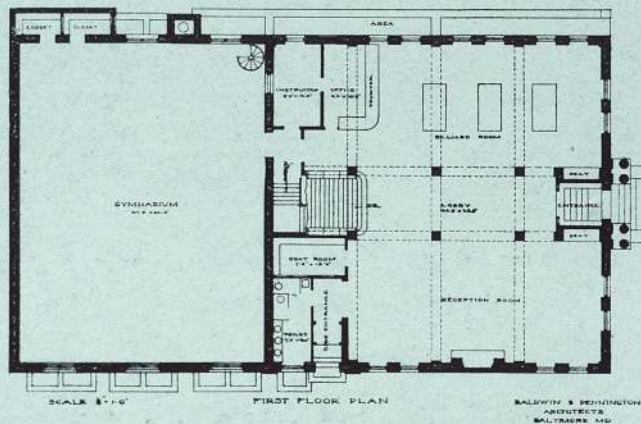
Basement Floor Plan, Y. M. C. A.

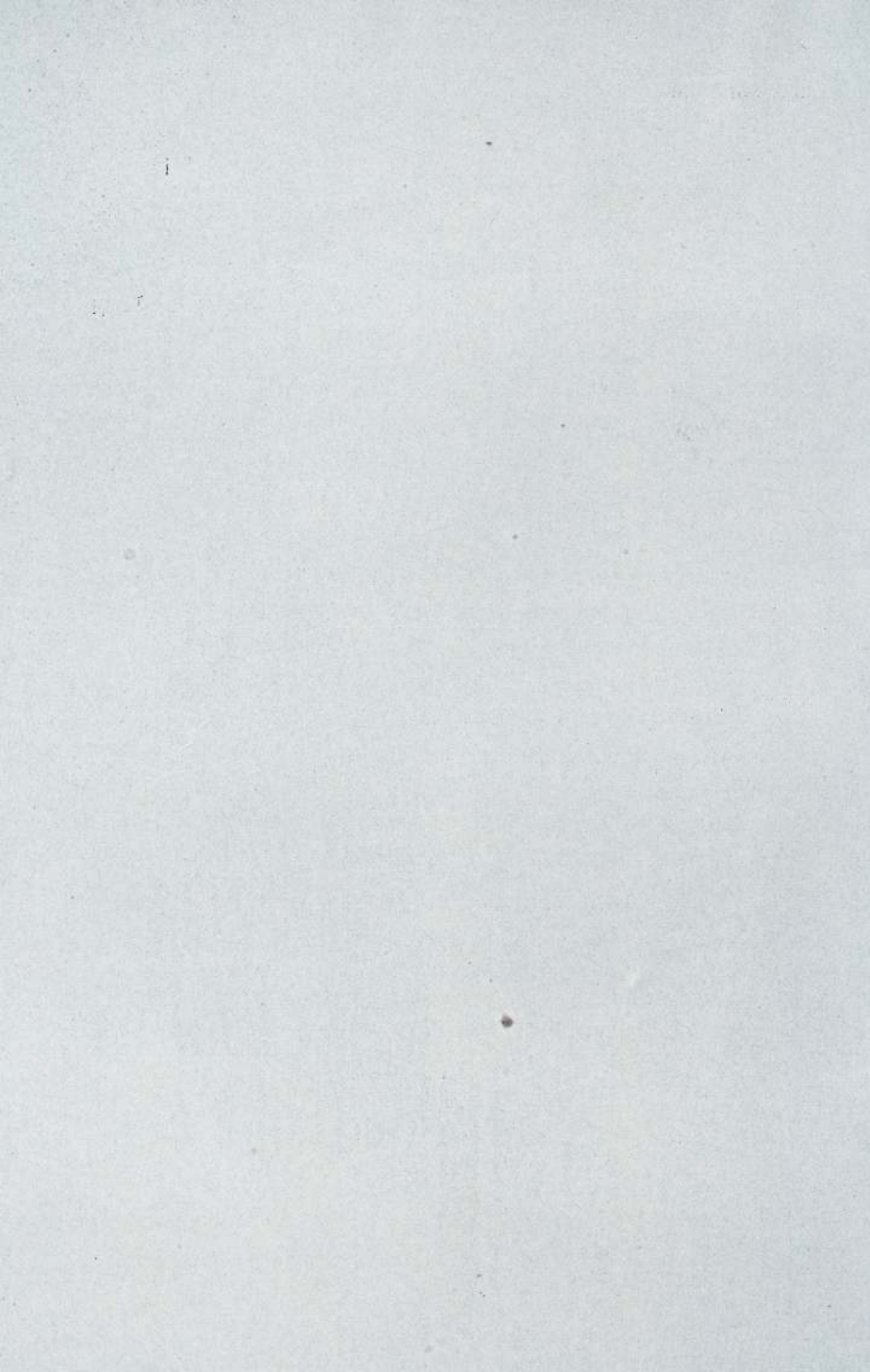

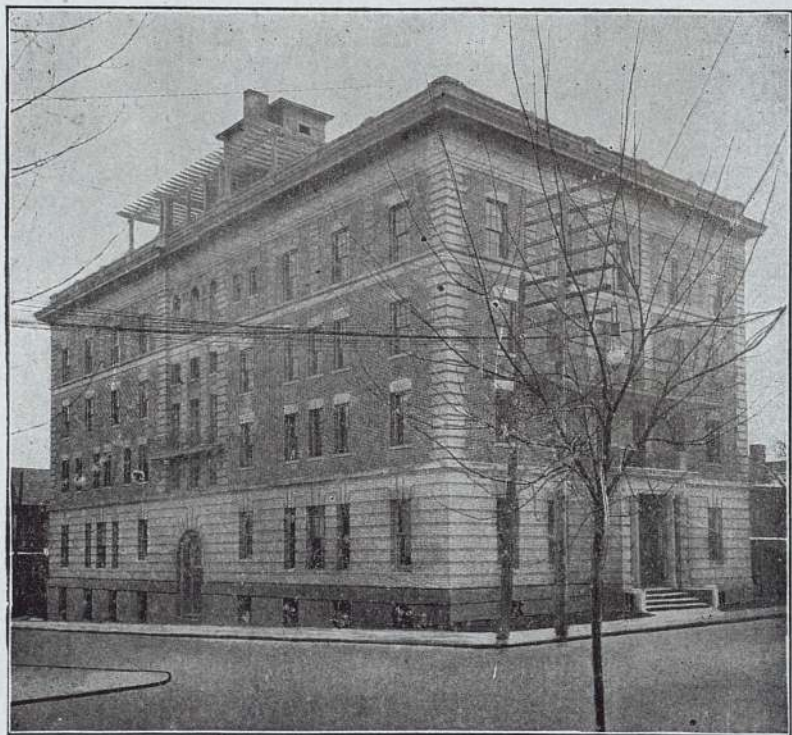

CONSTITUTION.

The following is the Constitution governing the Association:

ARTICLE I.—Name and Objects.

Section 1. The name of this Association shall be the West Virginia State Poultry Association.

Section 2. Its object shall be to encourage an interest and promote improvement in all that pertains to the poultry industry, and to hold annual exhibitions at such times and places as shall be designated by the officers of the Association.

ARTICLE II.—Officers.

Section 1. The officers of this Association shall consist of a President, Vice President, Secretary-Treasurer and an Executive Committee of four members, and there shall be a Board of Directors consisting of the above named seven officers.

Section 2. The officers shall be elected by a majority of all votes cast at the annual meeting and to serve one year commencing on the first day of February of each year, following this election, and shall serve until their successors are elected and qualified. Vacancies in any office during the year shall be filled by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE III.—Membership.

Section 1. The membership of this Association shall not be limited as to number nor place of residence, but all fanciers are urged to join.

Section 2. All applicants for membership shall be, upon the payment of the membership fee and upon receiving a majority of the votes of the Association present at any meeting, received and enrolled as members.

Section 3. The membership fee shall be one dollar, annual dues fifty cents.

Section 4. Any member of this Association who shall be in arrears for annual dues for two years shall be notified of the same by the Secretary, and should he fail to pay up shall then be dropped from the roll of membership by the Secretary.

ARTICLE IV.

Section 1. Any amendment to or alteration or appeal of this constitution must be presented to the Board of Directors, in meeting, who will present the same with their approval or recommendation at any annual meeting of the Association, and upon receiving a two-thirds vote of the members present shall be adopted.

ARTICLE V.

Section 1. Upon any member being charged with unfair dealing in connection with the poultry interests or with other conduct derogatory to the standing of the Association, the Board of Directors shall examine into the matter, and if it shall find the charge sustained the offending member may be expelled by a two-thirds vote of all the members of the Board of Directors.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. The premiums of this Association, except where noted, are not restricted to any State. All entries must be made on entry blanks furnished by the Secretary, and entry fees paid in full at the time the entry is made. Entries for competition must be in to the Secretary at Weston, W. Va., or J. W. Upton, Fairmont, W. Va., by November 30.

Shipping.

2. Express charges must be prepaid, direct to J. W. Upton, Superintendent, Fairmont, who will see that all stock is properly cared for and returned at the close of the exhibition. It will therefore be unnecessary for the owner to accompany them. All specimens entered at risk of owners. The Association will not be responsible for loss by fire or otherwise, but will exercise all responsible vigilance in the care of exhibits and the police arrangements of the hall day and night.

3. Any specimen showing symptoms of disease when received or during exhibition will be immediately removed from the hall and cared for by the Association and the owner notified.

4. All specimens must be the property of the exhibitor. Any false statement in regard to ownership will exclude the specimen from competition.

5. All exhibits should be in attractive coops with suitable conveniences for food and water and easily opened for judging and attendance. Exhibitors will furnish their own coops, which should be near regulation size, 2 feet deep, 2½ feet high, 2 feet to 4 feet long. For bantams, pigeons, turkeys, etc., size may vary according to requirements.

6. Exhibitors are requested to have their name and address on their coops, also the name of the express company by which to return them.

7. The American Standard of Perfection will be the guide in awarding all premiums.

To win a first prize, birds must score 90 points or over.

To win a second prize, birds must score 89 points or over.

- To win a third prize, birds must score 88 points or over.
To win a first prize, pens must score 180 points or over.
To win a second prize, pens must score 178 points or over.
To win a third prize, pens must score 175 points or over.

8. In competitions for special or other prizes the term "highest scoring pen," "highest scoring male," etc., shall be interpreted to mean highest scoring pen of chickens, highest scoring cock or cockerel, etc., and in no case shall turkeys, ducks or pigeons compete against chickens unless it be so stated in the conditions of the prize as offered. Nor shall bantams of any variety compete for specials or sweepstakes or other prizes against other chickens unless it shall be so stated in the premium offer.

9. Cards showing the entry number and number of exhibitor will be attached to each coop as soon as placed in position. The premium and scores will be attached to the coops as soon as possible after the awards are indorsed.

10. Color of premium ribbons: First prize, blue; second prize, red; third prize, yellow.

11. The weighing of birds by competent persons will commence Tuesday morning, December 3, and birds not in their coops by 7:00 p. m. of that day cannot compete for prizes offered. All birds entered for competition to be scored free of charge.

Leg Bands.

12. All specimens must be banded; birds arriving unbanded will be banded by the Superintendent and a fee of 5 cents charged the owner. No exhibitor will be allowed to change a specimen from one coop to another, or leg bands from one bird to another, after judging has commenced.

13. The term "specimen" implies anything for which a premium is offered.

Cock—A male specimen hatched prior to 1907.

Hen—A female specimen hatched prior to 1907.

Cockerel—A male specimen hatched during 1907.

Pullet—A female specimen hatched during 1907.

14. The judges are strictly prohibited from making known their awards, except through the Executive Committee.

Any person attempting to interfere with the judges in any way will be excluded from competition and exhibition.

The owner's name will be placed on the coop after the awards have been made.

15. All protests against awards must be made in writing and delivered to the Secretary before the last day of the show, and if after it has been thoroughly investigated by the Executive Committee, it shall prove without foundation, the award or awards, if any be due, shall be forfeited; but if true the wrong shall be righted and the proper award allowed.

16. A breeding pen shall consist of one male and four females, and may be composed of birds from four months old and over.

17. Specimens entered singly or in pens may compete for two or more prizes.

18. Should two or more specimens score a tie, the tie shall be broken by giving preference to the specimen nearest the standard weight.

19. No exhibitor will be allowed to handle any bird but his own. Any one doing so will forfeit his premium and score card.

20. Judging will commence at 9 a. m., the 3rd. Ship your birds so they may be scored on that day, if possible.

21. Any case not provided for in these rules and regulations will be referred to the Executive Committee for decision.

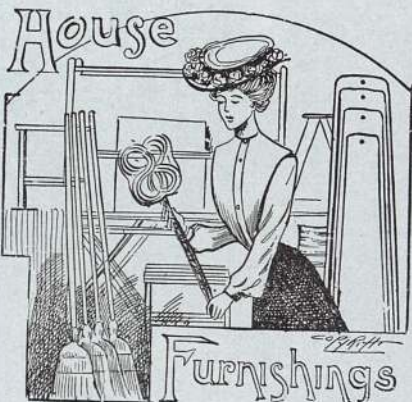

ENTRY FEES.

An entry fee of 25 cents will be charged for each single chicken. A fee of \$1.00 will be charged for each pen consisting of one male and four females.

Birds entered as a pen may also be entered singly without extra charge.

Ducks, geese and turkeys entered on the same terms as chickens.

Birds entered singly at 25 cents each.

Cats and dogs entered singly. The fee is 25 cents each.

Rabbits are entered singly or in pairs. The fee is 15 cents for one or 25 cents per pair. Doe and litter 25 cents.

Specimens entered for scoring only, and not for competition, 15 cents each. Specimens entered for scoring only can be sold and moved during the show if the owner so desires.

An admission of 10 and 25 cents will be charged at the door. All members of the Association holding membership cards and exhibitors will be admitted free. All school children to be admitted one day free. Arrangements to be made by the Secretary and school officers.

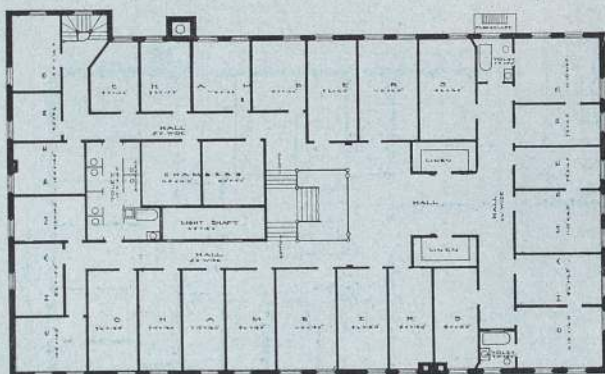

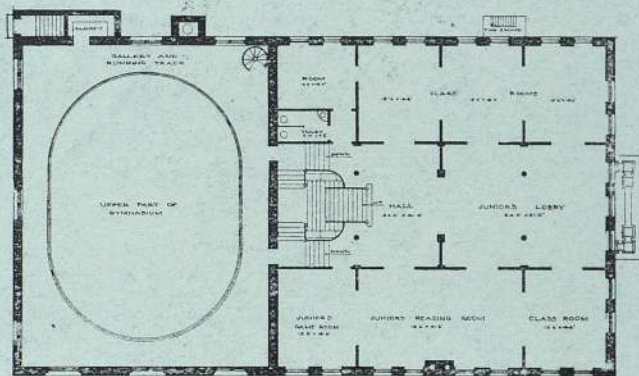

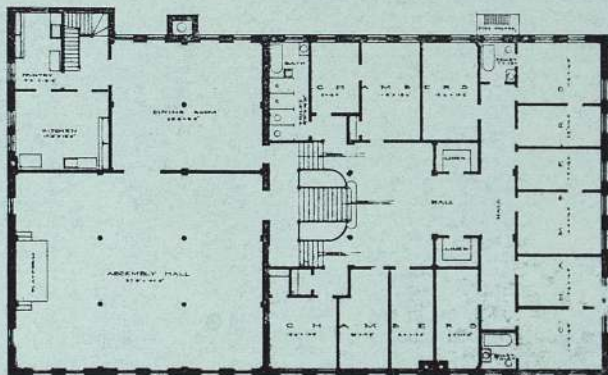

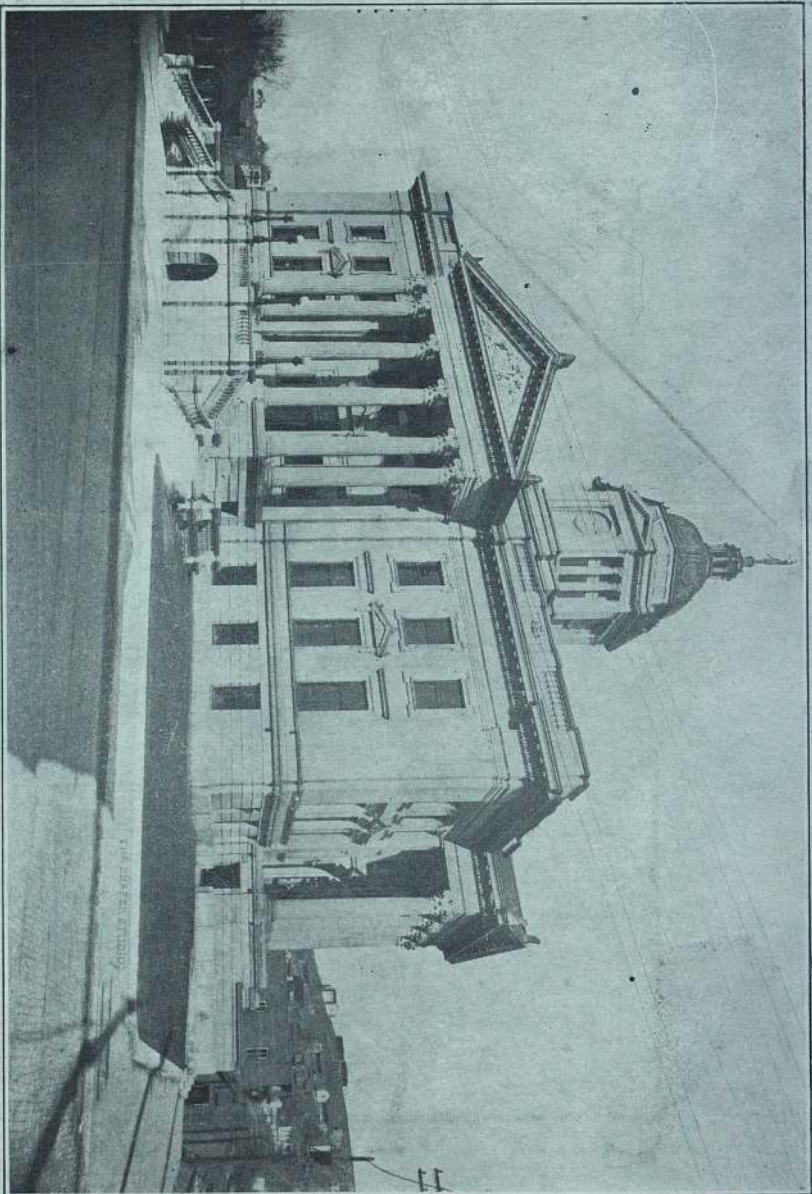
