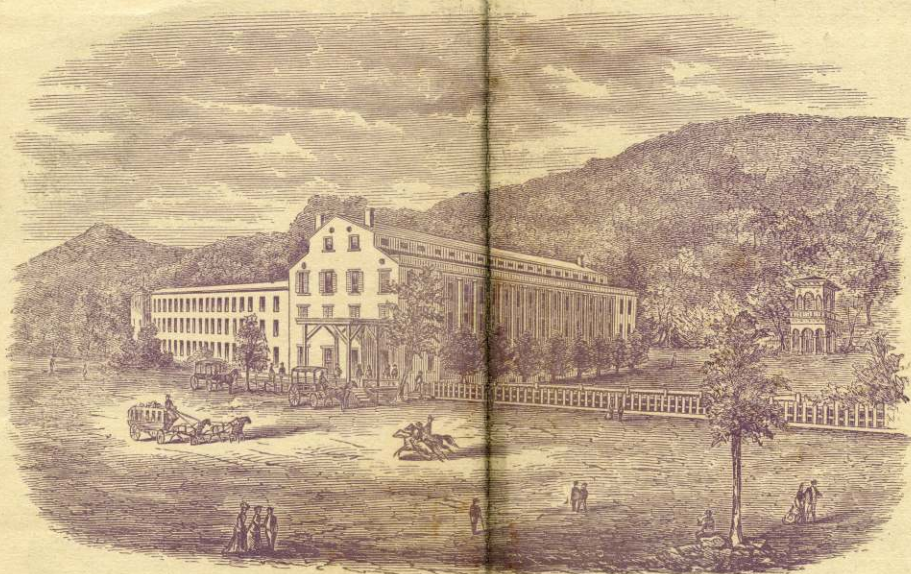

THE SEASON AT THIS CELEBRATED SUMMER RESORT WILL COMMENCE JUNE 10, 1874.

THE BERKELEY SPRINGS HOTEL, with accommodations for Five Hundred Guests, is surrounded by a beautiful Grove containing the Springs, which was originally the property of Lord Fairfax, who made a gift of them to the Commonwealth of Virginia, which placed them in the hands of Trustees to be improved and managed for the public benefit. These Springs are situated in a HIGH and HEALTHY MOUNTAIN DISTRICT—and is widely known as the most healthful, charming and popular Summer Resort in Virginia. In addition to their present celebrity, these Springs have a history intimately connected with the great names and events of the early days of the Republic—near this place the ill-fated army of Braddock passed when marching to its doom in 1775. Gen. George Washington, Charles Carroll of Carrollton, General Horatio Gates, and a number of other distinguished men purchased lots here and built Cottages, to which they resorted with their families, both during and after the Revolution.

The SPACIOUS and ELEGANT BALL ROOM has been refitted, which, with the NEW DINING ROOMS, PARLORS, PORTICOES, HALLS, RECEPTION and SITTING ROOMS, and MANY OF THE CHAMBERS ARE LIGHTED WITH GAS, the latter provided with the best HAIR MATTRESSES—BOWLING, BILLIARDS, QUOIT and CROQUET GROUNDS, CHESS ROOMS, RIDING, DRIVING, FISHING, HUNTING AND ALL OTHER AMUSEMENTS.
