

## Mount Pleasant School 1859-1860

The Mount Pleasant school house was situated at the cross roads a short distance from where the Triune church now stands. It was a small hewn log building. There John W. Mason, (who then used the initials "W. J.") began a school Monday, November 7th, 1859. He was then between 17 and 18 years of age. Quite a number of his pupils were about the same age.

It will be observed that this was prior to the formation of the state of West Virginia and several years before the public school system was inaugurated.

School houses, such as they were, were built and maintained by the people of the neighborhood in which they were located. The teachers were paid by the patrons, suplemented by a small sum furnished by the Commonwealth, to aid persons of limited means. It was the custom for the teacher to require the patrons of the school to enter into a written contract. Only a very few of these contracts are now in existence. The contract under which this school was taught is still in the posses-

sion of the teacher. It is here copied verbatim, as follows:

"Orthography, Reading, Arithmetic, Geography, English Grammar, Natural Philosophy, and Penmanship, will be taught in Mount Pleasant school-house, for the term of four and one halt months; W. J. Mason preceptor. Term \$3 per scholar which we the undersigned agree to pay said Mason at the expiration of his term. School to commence the first Monday in November, 1859.



The school closed Saturday, March 10th, 1860. At the end of the memoranda kept by Mr. Mason, at the time, he added the following:

"School closed this evening at Fairmont church where we gave a public exhibition; after which addresses were made by Isaac Reed, Esq., and A. L. Wade, all of which received universal approval."
