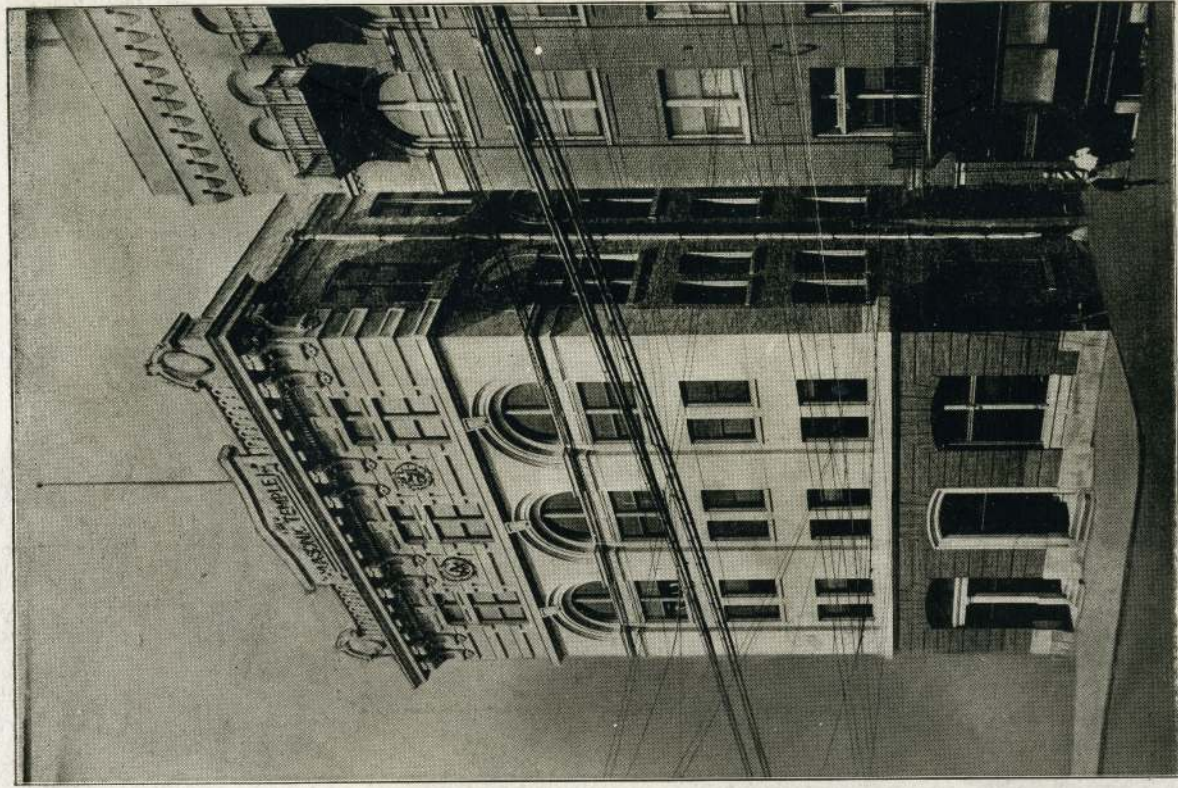

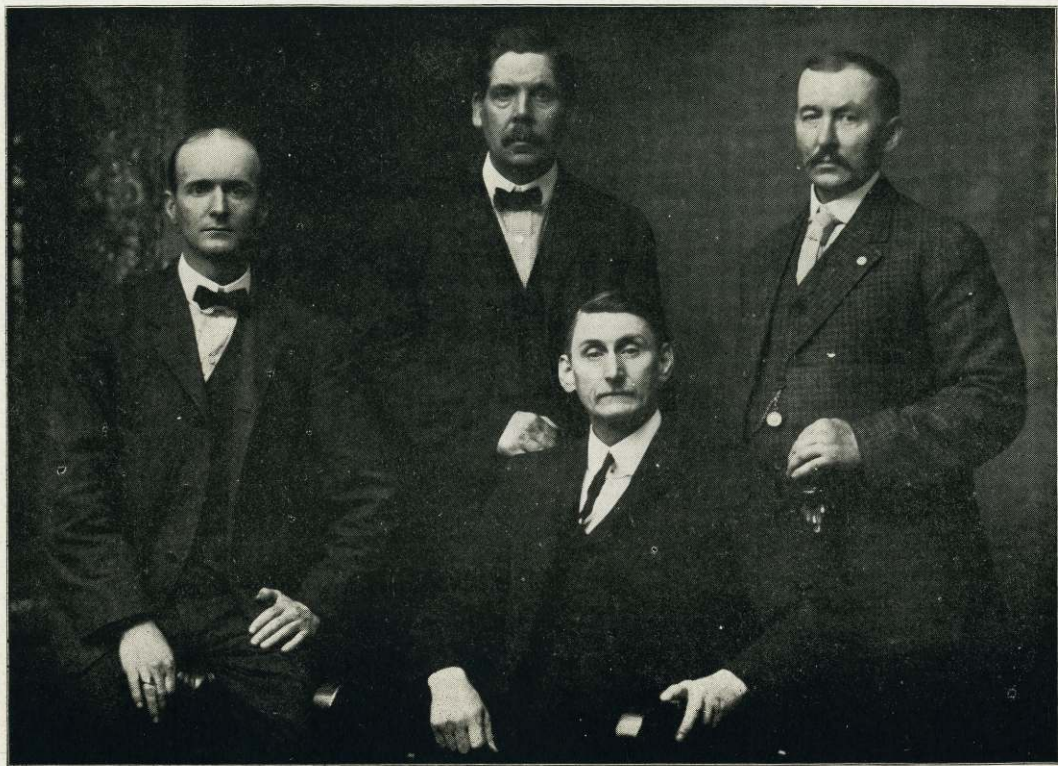

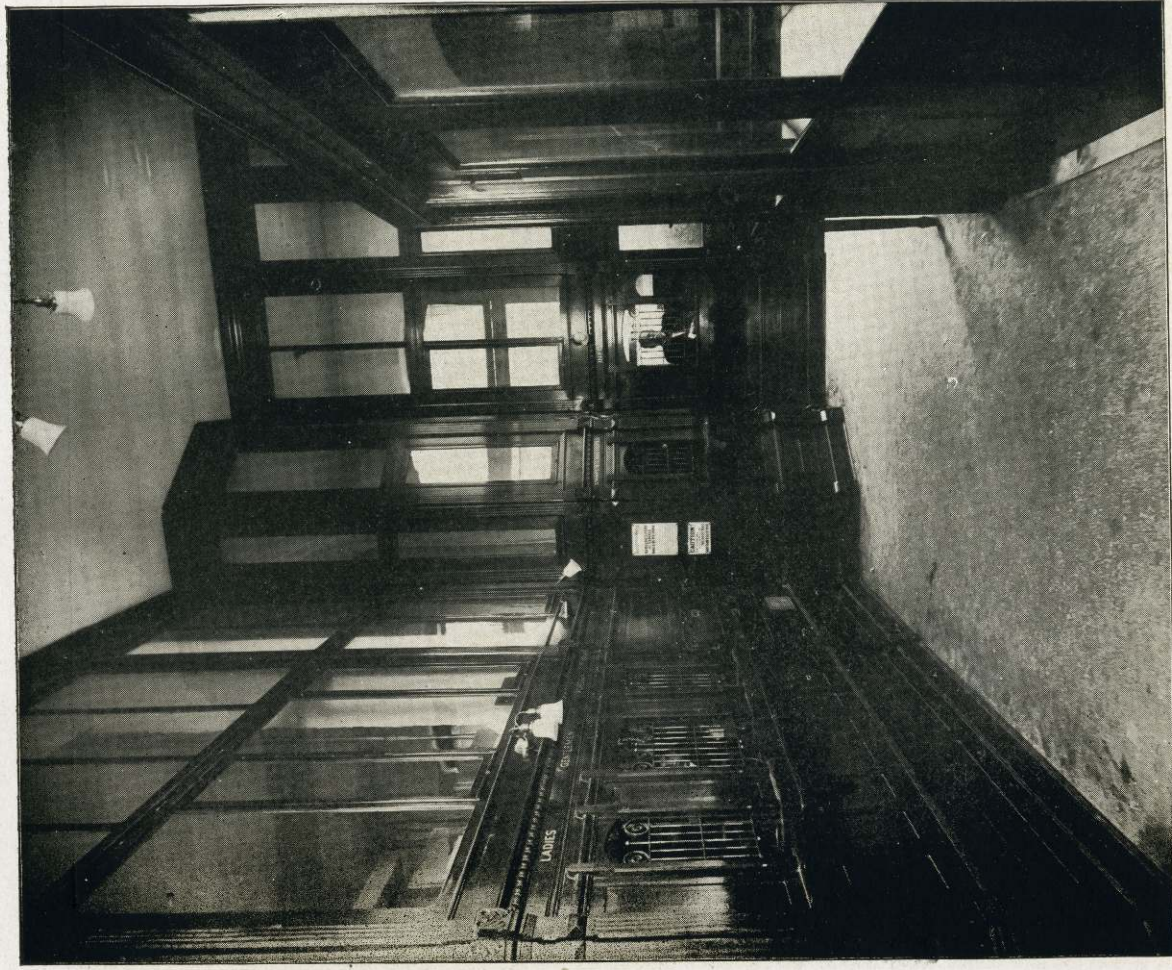

## DATA.

The Fairmont Post Office occupies the entire first floor of the new Masonic Temple on Jefferson street, and has a floor space of 4,870 square feet, and is one of the largest, best arranged and equipped post offices in West Virginia.

Each Department is separate and distinct within itself, being cut off with partitions and screen work. The equipment is the most modern and up-to-date that can be procured. All carriers and dumping tables are made with maple tops and of the latest pattern. The Mailing Room is supplied with the very best equipment, including a sixty-four sectional and portable bag rack and electric cancelling machine.

The office is supplied with 540 automatic combination lock-boxes, fire and burglar proof safe and vaults.

The private offices are nicely carpeted, and are supplied with numbering machines, two Oliver Typewriters, Burroughs Adding Machine, Rapid Roller Copier, desks and filing cases.

The office has one of the best inspector's look-outs in the country.

City Free Delivery service was established December 15, 1898, and Rural Free Delivery service on April 1, 1900.

Receipts for the year ending June 30th, 1907 (estimated), \$38,500.00. Amount of business transacted in the Money Order Department for the four quarters ending March 31, 1907, \$1,396,000.30. Total number of letters handled in the Registry Division for the four quarters ending March 31, 1907, 22,029.

Alter July 1st, Fairmont Post Office will have four stations. Two independent stations, Watson and Monongah. Two numbered stations. No. 1 located on Water street, First Ward. No. 2 located at 7th St. and Locust Ave., Fifth Ward.
