#### Calendar.

THE annual session of this school consists of two terms. The first term begins Wednesday, September 17th, and ends Friday, December 21st. The second begins the first Wednesday in January, and ends Friday, June 2d.

### Announcement of Music.

This school has been giving such advantages in music as are usually given in similar schools, but there seemed to be a demand in our school for better advantages, and to meet this want we have decided to have, in connection with the College, a school of music.

We have employed experienced teachers, one of whom was educated in the New England Conservatory at Boston, and taught for us last year. We will use the same text books as are used in the New England Conservatory, and the course in this school will be pursued the same through the fourth grade, which will give a thorough and extended course in music.

# Tuition.

Piano or Organ, \$45, per session of nine months. Voice Culture, \$5 per month.

Harmony, \$5 per month.

History of Music, Sight Singing and Chorus Drill, \$2.50 per month.

For rates of tuition in other branches of music, address the Principal.

In addition to our regular course, we have made special arrangements to give a Normal Course for the Prepar-

ation of teachers of Instrumental and Vocal Music.

This course will begin the 27th of October and continue for eight weeks. No pains will be spared to make it meet, in every way, the varied wants of teachers of both Vocal and Instrumental Music.

#### Quition.

Vocal, including Voice Culture, \$20 for eight weeks. For first instrument, \$20; \$10 for each additional instrument.

Board and other expenses will be the same as for literary pupils. Students not wishing to devote their entire time to music can enter classes in any other department of the school. See catalogues and circulars of literary department.

Shelton College has been under the same management for eight years. It is a boarding school, and a first-class school for young ladies and youths, as they are under careful home influences. Young men can get cheap board in private families.

# General Information.

#### ENROLLMENT.

The first duty of all students at the opening of each term is to enroll at the Principal's office. Students will not be admitted to recitations until they have enrolled and paid tuition, \$1.00 matriculation and room rent for the term. Board is payable monthly in advance.

No money will be refunded unless in case of death or such sickness as will prevent attending the school hereafter. But students honorably excused in case of necessity will receive a draw on the school for the amount of money paid in and not consumed. This draw is payable only in such benefits as that for which it was paid. Any student being expelled or suspended forfeits all money paid into the school.

It will be seen that our charges are exceedingly low. Hardly another first-class institution anywhere offers equal inducements in this respect, and it is our purpose to make the College first-class in all its appointments just as rapidly as possible. No inferior work is to be allowed. Only the best teachers are employed.

Our aim is not to hurry students through a course of study in a superficial manner, but to teach them habits of observation and thought, to qualify them for true living and the highest success by making them masters of their own powers.

Any student desiring to sever his connection with the school, except at the end of a term, must obtain permission from the Principal.

All students who expect to enter are requested to make their purpose known to the Principal in advance by letter. Lady students especially should do this.

If they will state just when they will arrive, they will be met by the school authorities.
