PREFACE.

Huntington is a city of between ten and twelve thousand inhabitants. The town was laid out and the first house was built in the year 1871. From ten to twelve thousand people in eighteen years, while it may not look large to a western man who has become accustomed to this sort of growth, is a pretty good showing for the slow-going South.

Because of this rapid development, few of the people have been here for a sufficient length of time to become acquainted with a very great number of others. Fifty per cent of the people are strangers. The author of this Manual recently made the statement in a prayer meeting talk, that "one half the members of the Methodist church were strangers to the other half."

This is a condition of things which should not remain true any longer than it will take to remedy it. This Manual is issued for the purpose of obviating, in a measure at least, this difficulty. It gives the names and residences of every member of the church, so that all can see and know them. It also gives, in as full a form as could possibly be inserted in so small a book, the history of the church from its organization. It also furnishes information regarding the different departments of church work, and the various organizations connected with the church.

It is sincerely hoped that all those into whose hands this Manual comes, will be inspired by the information which it furnishes and by the prosperity to which it bears testimony to greater love for the church of their choice, and to greater interest in church work. There is a place somewhere for YoU. Seek it, and find it, and fill it.

Brief History of the Church.


Hon. William A. Wilceler when Vice President of the United States, sent a check for a thousand dollars to Chaplain McCabe, to aid in building Methodist churches on the Western frontier. Along with the money he sent a message, which was in substance as follows, "You Methodists go before, and clear out the underbrush, and open up the way, and then we Presbyterians will follow, and take advantage of your work."

The Methodist Church in this country, has been a PIONEER church. It has rarely been second in forming an orgonization in any locality. It has followed the emigrant to his Western home, and when neighborhoods have been formed, it has held services in the cabin and "dug-out" until a building could be erected. When a town or city has been laid out, the ubiquitous Methodist preacher has usually been among the first to appear on the survey to look after the building of a church.

True to its history, the Methodist Episcopal Church was the first of the churches to enter the city of Huntington, and effect an organization

In February 1872, only a few months after the town was laid out, a little company of Methodists met in Mr. A. B. Palmer's carpenter shop, on 3rd Avenue, where the sash and door factory is now located, and formed a class, which became the nucleus of the present society.



The members of this first class were, A. B. Palmer, Thos. Medford, B. P. Driggs, Bro. Lawder and Bro. Dunham. Bro. Lawder was appointed as the first class leader. A Sunday School was organized immediately, and A. B. Palmer elected Superintendent, which place he filled for a number of years with great success.

At the conference held in the Spring of 1872, Rev. J. A. Kibbe was appointed the first pastor, and regular preaching services were begun. The first sermon was preached in the shop, to a small but deeply interested congregation. The house was warmed by a cooking stove, and Bro-Palmer's dinner table served the preacher for a pulpit; and t also often served him bountifully in another capacity.

Shortly after the coming of Bro. Kibbe, the place of meeting was changed from the shop to Burdick's Hall; after a time, from there to Gibson's Hall; and still later to Ingham's Hall; and from there into the present church building. All the time the town was growing, and the membership was increasing.

The present church building was completed and moved into Jan. 24th, 1875. The dedicatory sermon was preached by Rev. W. M. Mullenix, then pastor of the church at Charleston. Rev. W. C. Griffith, now a member of the Baltimore Conference, was pastor at the time the church was built, who, with R. Shore and A. B. Palmer constituted the building committee.

The lot on which the church was built was wisely selected on the corner of 4th ave. and 10th street, and bought of the Central Land Company, A copy of the title to the lot, together with the names of those who subscribed to purchase it, is still in possession of Mr. K. Delabar.

The church was built in the center of the lot, leaving room on the corner facing 4th Avenue for a new church, which we hope to build soon, and room on the opposite corner, facing, 10th street, for a parsonage. The parsonage, a neat, comfortable and commodious home, was built in 1882.
