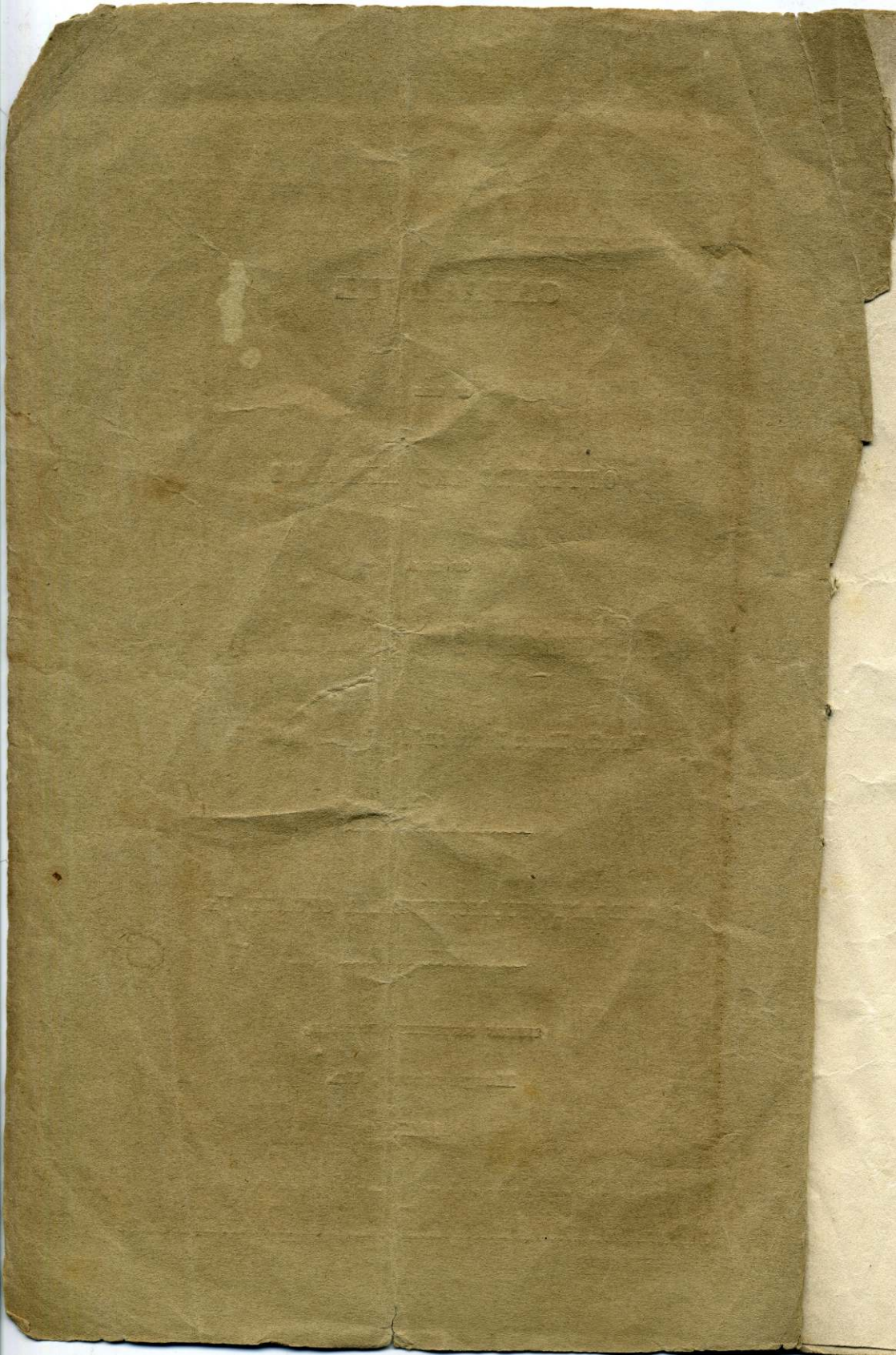

T E R M S .

Tuition, per Session of Five Months:

Reading, Writing, Spelling, Primary Arithmetic and Primary Geography, - -	\$ 4 00
English Grammar, Geography, Arithmetic and History of the United States, -	6 00
Algebra, Geometry, Natural, Moral and Mental Philosophy, Chemistry, Botany, Rhetoric, Astronomy with the use of Globes, Anatomy Physiology and Hygiene, Universal History, and Political Class Book, -	9 00
Ornamental Needle Work, - - -	10 00
French and Drawing, - - -	12 00
Music on the Piano Forte, including the use of instrument, - - - -	14 00
Painting in Oil Colors, - - - -	15 00
Boarding, (including lodging, fuel and lights,) in the family of the Principal, -	33 00

Board can also be obtained in some private families for \$1 50 per week.

Exercises in Composition and Vocal Music, will be attended to without additional charge.

The Academical year is divided into two sessions of five months each; the first commences on the *second Monday in September*; the second, on the *third Monday in February*; leaving a vacation of one week between the sessions, and seven weeks at the end of the year. A public examination of the classes takes place at the end of the Winter Session.

TIME OF ENTERING.

It is important that all Pupils should be present at the beginning of the Session; but if any find this impracticable, they will be received at any time during the session, and charged accordingly.

TEXT BOOKS.

McGuffey's Eclectic Readers; Smith's Arithmetic; Mitchell's Geography; Kirkham's Grammar; Hale's History of U. S.; Davies' Algebra; Geometry, Playfair's Euclid; Comstock's Philosophy, Chemistry, and Botany; Blair's Rhetoric; Abercrombie's Intellectual Philosophy; Wayland's Moral Science; Guy's Astronomy, and Burritt's Geography of the Heavens; Sullivan's Political Class Book; Mrs. Willard's Universal History; Doct. Cutter's Anatomy, Physiology and Hygiene or the Laws of Health. *French*: Levizac's Grammar, Collott's French Reader, Dialogues and Phrases; Vie de Washington, Charles XII; Le Brun's Telemaque; La Henriade, &c.

LOCATION.

This Seminary is pleasantly situated in the borough of Morgantown, on the Monongahela river, about 60 miles from Pittsburg, and only 25 miles from the National Road at Uniontown. It is located in a community of good moral habits, and religious character, and in a region proverbially healthy. There are four Churches in the town, viz: Presbyterian, Baptist, Methodist Episcopal, and Methodist Protestant; where divine service is stately performed. Pupils from abroad will attend whatever Church and Sabbath School their Parents or Guardians may designate.

GOVERNMENT.

The method of discipline is such as to encourage virtue and merit, strictly guarding against that severity which runs into oppression, as well as that inefficiency which will not punish disobedience and immorality. Parents may be assured that the moral training of their children will be strictly attended to, and every inducement held out to arouse to noble and generous action.
